A Murfreesboro native, Dr. Sarah Follis Barlow earned two degrees from Middle Tennessee State College: BS in Biology with minors in chemistry, history, English, and secondary education in 1956 and an MA in Natural Science in 1963. She went on to earn an Ed.D. from Peabody College at Vanderbilt University in 1990.

Dr. Barlow taught the Honors section of Exploring Life (formerly Topics in Biology), the non-majors biology course. For many years, she was the coordinator for the course, and she also coordinated the pre-occupational therapy program and pre-health information management program.

Sarah was one of the first biology faculty invested in teaching through technology and assisted other faculty during an internship through what was formerly known as the Faculty Instructional Technology Center. Creative and clever, she worked campus-wide with other faculty in implementing the use of technology in their classes.
